United Way approves budget

SORBONNE, Ind. – The United Way has approved the largest budget in UW history. Saul Prelate, president of the board called the meeting while Artopeos Kalixt, treasurer of Sorbonne Savings Bank, read the report for budget committee.

Kalixt reports that the 36 UW agencies are asking for a total of \$2,950,046.50 to support yearly activities. The UW itself has asked for \$300,000. The committee cut figures to \$2.8 million for agencies and \$250,000 for headquarters. The recommended budget (raised in Oct. campaign) will be the largest in UW history.

The president of Wolfson Investments, UW member and president of YMCA, Walt Wolfson, requested to hold a capital fund drive in Feb. to raise \$1.5 million for a new indoor swimming pool in the YMCA. Wolfson's requests are denied.

Dr. Marilyn Clements, president of Sorbonne City College, made a brief statement to close the meeting, " I consider my election to be a great challenge and honor. We have a difficult job ahead of us, but I'm sure we will meet our goal. I certainly pledge my total commitment of time and effort."
